Caveat emptor

- Malheureusement, la majeure partie de la recherche aux États-Unis se concentre uniquement sur les aspects de la radicalisation et du recrutement dans les organisations terroristes telles que l'État islamique.
- Dans la littérature académique et les rapports gouvernementaux, il est rarement fait état d'un lien direct ou d'une similarité entre le phénomène de radicalisation et celui des cultes – mais, de temps à autre, il en est fait mention dans les médias.
- Les autres formes de radicalisation extrême telles que l'extrême droite ou d'autres groupes haineux ou de cultes dangereux sont peu reconnues.

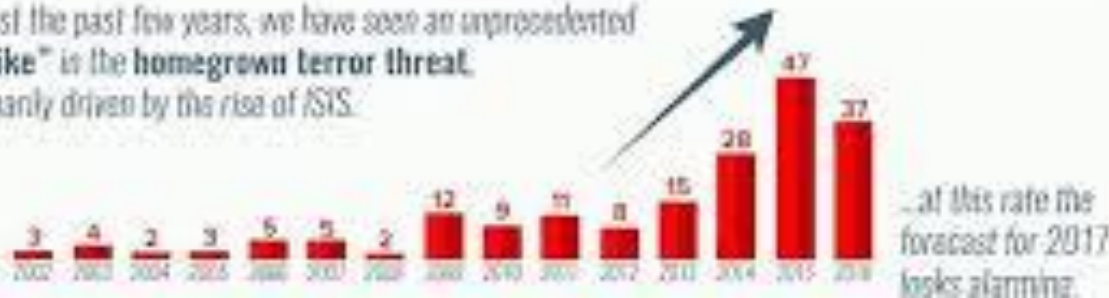

Muslim Outreach Operation Underway

The Los Angeles Sheriff's Department has assigned two of its Muslim officers to accompany other Muslim living and working in the southern California county.

Sergeant Mike Mohamed and Deputy Sheriff Mostafa are part of the Muslim Community Affairs Unit, an outreach program established in August 2007 to address issues involving hate crimes and discrimination facing the Muslim community.

"We are from the community," Deputy Mostafa explained.

"We understand the issues that matter to the community, and we provide a voice for the community."

The Muslim Community Affairs unit now includes a training program for the Muslim community on law enforcement issues, including domestic violence, gang and identity theft.

The unit also trains department members about Islam and Muslims, teaching on issues such as beliefs and customs.

Academy recruits also receive a one-hour class on Muslim culture and background as part of the related awareness training program.

And the training goes two ways. "It's become an informational tool where the community can educate law enforcement as well," Mostafa notes.

The new LASD unit, established by Sheriff Lee Baca, has joined a Young Muslim American Leaders Group to engage and educate young Muslim professionals in the Los Angeles Area. The group meets weekly.

Deputy Mostafa says mem-

bers of the Muslim Community Affairs Unit are available for the community. "We're here if you need us," he says.

"Having this partnership with the community defuses the stigma that surrounds these guest communities."
